

Enhancing Student Participation and Language Skills with Creative Writing Activities: The Case Study of Upper Secondary Students from a School in Romania

State of the Art

There is a high demand for proficiency in English, because this language facilitates working in larger, international teams and it is perceived as the *lingua franca* of the present times.



Research Purpose

The study aimed to investigate the effectiveness and the benefits of teaching English as a Foreign Language with the help of Creative Writing.

Methodology

Selected instruments:

- 2 sets of questionnaires (15 statements about various elements) for students inviting another EFL teacher to observe the sessions and give feedback;
- all the student-participants at the end of the investigation.



The sample

- The study sample included 50 students from 3 different upper secondary grades from a school in the Western part of Romania, that were preliminary tested for B1 level of English.
- ✓ 2 EFL teachers.

Result 1:

! All student participants underlined the fact that the Creative Writing assignments were beneficial for them and for improving their interest in English language.

Result 2:

Inhe researcher-teacher diary disclosed that the teachers experienced a feeling of accomplishment while watching all the participants involved in discussing ideas and participating actively in the teaching-learning process of English language.
